New for 2018-19! National Mental Health Network



On the **11 December** in **London** NPAG is launching a brand new group with an exciting first meeting programme.

Programme highlights will include:

'The priorities in the Mental Health Sector for 2019 and beyond'

Professor Tim Kendall, National Clinical Director for Mental Health, NHS England and NHS Improvement

Professor Tim Kendall will be sharing the latest national perspective on the priorities facing the Mental Health sector as we enter 2019. He will also provide insights on the new NHS long-term plan, and the priorities for mental health for the next ten years.

'Exploring alternatives to inpatient admissions'

University College London, SSG Health & NHS Mental Health Trusts

UCL will present early findings from their study into UK admission alternatives. SSG Health is a leading specialist in healthcare operational and financial transformation. Its mental health transformation team was the first team to be paired by NHSI under the national FIP programme to provide operating model change support to a mental health trust. SSG will be joined by trusts to describe practical evidence-based examples of admission avoidance.

As with all NPAG network groups, the aim here is to add value by delivering regular meetings, with agendas built around the needs and interests of the people who work in the sector – people like you!

The network will be guided by national agendas such as The Five Year Forward View, Lord Carter's review into unwarranted variations in mental health and community health services and NHS Improvement's Model Hospital programme. Rather than simply repeating the principles of these though, NPAG will be seeking to work with you to highlight the elements within these 'big agendas' that are of most concern and interest and use NPAG's network and experience to help members manage and address them effectively.

We anticipate network meetings to cover a blend of subjects such as:

- **Operational challenges** e.g. reducing Out of Area Bed usage, reducing variation in services, meeting rising demand
- **Innovation** e.g. developing new models of care, working smarter with data, new technologies
- **Workforce** e.g. the implications of Brexit, engaging staff in improvement, effective workforce planning
- **Awareness** e.g. the role of education, working with other agencies to raise awareness and more...

The NPAG IT & Connectivity Network will commence it's 2nd round on the **24th January 2019 in London.**

IT systems reach out into all areas of healthcare and new mobile technology is bringing health IT into every aspect of our lives. Government / social pressures are causing a rush into data-sharing and connectivity without necessarily building the robust infrastructure, security, governance and supplier interfaces to ensure safe, reliable provision. Recognising the need to support NHS professionals in these areas, NPAG launched its IT & Connectivity Network in 2017.

The network brings together NHS Acute and Community IT professionals, Clinical Engineers and suppliers to understand and overcome some of the interoperability, security and connection issues. It allows shared learning and training across organisations, pulling together a sometimes-disparate community and gaining valuable insights from suppliers, government agencies and invited experts.


