Welcome to the February edition of NPAG News.

Last month we looked at the way NPAG national groups were approaching the NHS green agenda. We reported the offer by Members of the NPAG NHS Sustainability Leads Network to present to other groups on the subject of pursuing a Net Zero NHS and to support them in their work. Some have already taken up the kind offer.

All of this has encouraged us at NPAG to review our own approach to sustainability. We have always tried to minimise the impact of our activities and services upon the environment, but without the benefit of a formal sustainability plan against which we could gauge our progress over time.

Over the next few weeks we will be taking steps to develop our first NPAG Green Plan, taking into account the Greener NHS guidance and applying it to our particular service and operational requirements.

Given the way we operate traditionally, utilising the services of a number of partner agencies—venues, business partners and associates—the majority of our emissions and cost reduction opportunities actually lie outside our own operations. We are therefore keen to look into the measurement and management of these 'scope 3' emissions.

As the first green shoots of spring start to appear we will also be busy developing our programme of meetings and events. See pages 3 and 4 for details of the Theatres and Decontamination Conference in May.

The NPAG Network has been busy again. But looking back over recent months it is interesting to see that some groups use the Network far more than others. Let us know, if you are not a regular Network user, what we can do to make the service more relevant to you.
