NHS Transport & Logistics Best Practice Group 2022-23

The NHS Transport & Logistics Best Practice Group has just started a new round!

The group combines two main essentials: decades of in-house experience and quality presenters from within and outside the NHS. That way we build on proven good practice whilst having an eye to new systems and developments!

NPAG's focus is to innovate and support continuous improvement in the face of ever increasing pressure to save money and increase efficiency. Members proactively network discussing and sharing documents on the delivery of fleet management, logistics, parking and associated services.

Members drive the meeting agendas. They include established standing items which are addressed through knowledge and experience from the members and carefully selected guest speakers. Items include:

- Covid implications & issues
- Fleet: Grey, Green & Courier
- Pool Car Management
- Trust Policies and Procedures: impact on Transport, Waste & ADR
- Medical Records
- Driver Handbooks
- Management of Taxi services
- Vehicle procurement & management
- Legislation

Members come from a variety of Trust types from across England and Wales. Members from NHS Wales have provided invaluable insight into how 'things' are done differently in the devolved nations, particularly over the last couple of years responding to Covid-19 and the vaccination programme. It would be good to have members join from the other devolved nations of Scotland and Northern Ireland to further widen the knowledge base.

The 2021 round of four meetings were held via Microsoft Teams due to the ongoing Covid restrictions and in order to attract a diverse range of members from across the Country. Guest speakers were invited from relevant Industry bodies including Highways England, Crown Commercial Services, Flockmobility and The Mileage Consultancy.

Such collaborations hold great potential for all involved sharing innovations across the whole spectrum of NHS Transport & Logistics.

The Group will continue to apply itself to keeping abreast of rapidly-emerging vehicle, infrastructure and software technologies and their potential for enhancing capabilities within the NHS.

The Group have agreed a further three meetings to be held in July, October and January 2023, one of which is hoped to be the first face to face meeting since pre-Covid.

EPRR Network 2022-23

Meeting 1: 4th May 2022, The Royal National Hotel, London

EPRR (Emergency Preparedness, Resilience and Response) has always been an extremely important function in the NHS. As it becomes even more important (as evidenced during the COVID-19 outbreak for example) so, therefore, does the role of the EPRR Network. The EPRR Network is a very well-established group (previously known as the Resilience Development Network) and is a very well-respected forum which has been serving NHS EPRR staff for several years.

The network receives external expert input at meetings from: Member of the Executive Council - The Institute of Civil Protection and Emergency Management, NHS Digital, NHS England and Improvement, plus other expert speakers in the field of EPRR. All of this, is complimented by the significant and vast knowledge and expertise of the network members themselves.


Keeping in touch - Email Exchange service
