A Vision for the Future

Event Report

On 12th September, NPAG hosted the 14th Annual Clinical Engineering Conference. The event saw over 65 delegates, 10 speakers and 27 exhibitors attend, with one speaker flying over from America specifically for the event!

Our theme, 'A Vision for the Future' was chosen to help us think ahead and to encourage us to learn from what colleagues are exploring in their departments. Whether it was a new way of managing home care maintenance or developing risk strategies, or even new ways to network, there was something for everyone.

We started the day hearing from Jake Palmer, Planning and Projects Lead for the DHSC on the National Equipment Tracking Information System (NETIS). Learning lessons from the pandemic, and seeking to inform the new Med Tech Strategy.

Paul White, Head of Clinical Engineering at Cambridge University Hospitals explained how virtual wards had been developed at Cambridge. The 'oximetry at home' project during Covid - with all the concerns over accuracy etc. - had nevertheless provided an opportunity to look more closely into setting up virtual wards. We learned how the project had moved on from the uncoordinated device-purchasing processes of the past to a daily 'virtual ward round' and standardised equipment.

Next, Jason Koster brought Cohealo Inc's vision of asset management to our attention. Working with NHS Supply Chain and major London hospitals, they have been taking data from clinical cases, inventory, clinician preferences, working day length and local knowledge to assess whether more equipment is required or whether it could be shared.

Thomas Hague from UCLH brought us back to the reality of trying to plan equipment maintenance through risk management.

The approach at UCLH will use the traditional Likelihood x Consequences model due to its familiarity amongst other professionals, making it understandable. A draft risk assessment form has been produced.

Oliver Pearson of British Medical Auctions turned the spotlight on Sustainability. The health service contributes around 4-5% of total UK carbon emissions and he asked how we can influence Scope 3 emissions in pursuit of a net zero NHS.

After lunch and a great networking opportunity, we heard from **Ruth Thomsen**, **Scientific Director NHSE**, who shared with us how the early days of the pandemic happened and how clinical engineers became involved.

Tackling lost and missing equipment was the subject of a presentation from **Kulpreet Singh**, **Quality Manager**, **Greater Glasgow and Clyde**. In the Glasgow area assets sent into the community (clinics and homes) were being lost and a sizeable £11m loss of some 7,300 assets projected. The rate of losing equipment in the community was said to be 2.5x higher than within a hospital.

Turning our attention to clinical developments, **Simon**Martin and Sam Bovan from SpaceLabs Healthcare
brought is up to date with the latest work in holter
recordings. The new challenges in this field result in
the analysis of huge amounts of data as the drive is
always to improve patient care, whilst providing a
solution for clinicians.

Our last presentation of the day was from the NPAG IT and Connectivity Network co-chairs, Patrick Maw, and Maryam Mirjafari.

A relatively new group set up specifically to work on this rapidly developing area where Clinical Engineering and IT meet. Members were asked to consider whether this subject is an area that they should be investing more time in and plans for future work were shared.

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

Meeting 1: 12th October 2023, MS Teams

The role of Violence Reduction & Security Management in the NHS is of great importance and so too is the role of the NPAG Violence Reduction & Security Management Network in supporting those involved in this area.

One of the major benefits is that it is a national network—thereby offering a greater range of sharing and learning than can be achieved with more local networks.

At our meetings important new initiatives have been presented & discussed. The Network has received legal advice relating to various issues or challenges that can be presented to those who manage security & related data has been shared amongst the group.

The Network has reviewed & commented on the new Violence Prevention & Reduction Standards recently published by NHSE. It has also received expert input from the HSE, industry representatives, and other leaders in the field.

Agendas are member led and include a 'Hot Topics' slot where members can raise current issues. Between meetings members network with each other, facilitated by NPAG, enabling members to seek advice, often getting answers the same day, even within the hour! This is a highly valuable facility and is available to anyone who ioins the VR&SM Network.
